HOST STUDENT PROGRAM – PRESENTATION (VERSION FRANCAISE)

Le Lycée Français de Chicago a été créé en 1995 par un groupe de parents français et américains, avec l'aide financière d'entreprises françaises et le soutien du Consulat Général de France de Chicago. Le Lycée est accrédité par le Ministère de l'Éducation Nationale et appartient au réseau scolaire officiel français comprenant plus de 450 écoles à l'étranger. Nous sommes également inscrits auprès de l'*Illinois Board of Education* et par ailleurs accréditée par l'Association des Ecoles Privées du Midwest (ISACS). Aujourd'hui l'établissement accueille plus de 550 étudiants représentant plus de 40 nationalités et depuis notre création nous avons 100% de réussite au baccalauréat.

Chaque année le Lycée Français de Chicago reçoit des étudiants français ou venant d'autres établissements français à l'étranger, qui de leur propre initiative font le choix de venir étudier au Lycée. En général ces étudiants viennent passer un semestre ou l'année scolaire au Lycée et sont accueillis par des familles du Lycée. Nous nous chargeons des démarches administratives pour l'obtention d'un visa étudiant et nous établissons la liste des familles intéressées à accueillir des étudiants.

Pour l'année scolaire 2009-2010, nous avons décidé d'offrir cette expérience à davantage d'étudiants venant de plusieurs établissements français. Ce programme s'adresse aux étudiants qui entreront en septembre en : **3EME, 2NDE, PREMIERE (S, L or ES), TERMINALE (S, L or ES)**.

Les étudiants qui désirent faire une demande d'inscription doivent remplir le formulaire ci-joint. Une présentation du Lycée et des entretiens auront lieu à Paris au printemps 2009. Les étudiants et leur familles seront alors mis en contact avec des familles d'accueil potentielles*. **La date limite d'inscription est le 20 avril 2009.**

HOST STUDENT PROGRAM – PRESENTATION (ENGLISH VERSION)

The Lycée Français de Chicago was founded in 1995 by a group of French and American parents, with backing from French businesses and the support of the Consul General of France in Chicago. The Lycée is accredited by the French Ministry of Education and is listed on the official directory of the French Schools in Foreign Countries as part of a French worldwide network which includes over 450 schools outside France. The school is also registered with the Illinois Board of Education and accredited by the Independent School Association of Central States (ISACS). Today the school has over 550 students representing more than 40 nationalities and since we opened, we have had 100% success rate at the *baccalauréat*.

Every year the Lycée Français de Chicago welcomes students coming from France or other lycées français whom, from their own initiative have decided to spend time studying at the Lycée. Typically a student comes to spend a semester or one academic year at the school and is hosted by a current family of the school. We attend to all the necessary administrative documents in order for the students to get a student visa and we gather a list of families interested in hosting the students.

For the 2009-2010 school year we have decided to present this opportunity to more students in more French institutions. This program is open for students entering the following grades in September 2009: **3EME, 2NDE, PREMIERE (S, L or ES), TERMINALE (S, L or ES)**.

Students interested in applying can do so by filling the application below. A presentation of the school and follow-up interviews will take place in Paris in the spring of 2009. The students and their families will then be put in contact with potential host families*. **Application deadline is April 20th 2009.**
