## Graduation Standards and Requirements

LFC students in the French Baccalaureate program usually graduate with two diplomas: a US high school diploma and the French Baccalaureate. French Baccalaureate coursework prepares students for a series of French national qualifying examinations known as the Baccalaureate (Bac). Final exams, both written and oral, are evaluated by external examiners. One of the hallmarks of the Bac is the Grand Oral, an oral defense of a one-year research project related to one or both of their grade 12 concentration courses.

## French Baccalaureate

LFC students in the French Baccalaureate program follow the curriculum established by the French Ministry of Education. Instruction is primarily in French with the exception of English and BFI courses (see below). This program, which culminates in rigorous examinations over the course of grades 11 and 12 , fosters self-discipline and organization while encouraging the development of critical thinking and analytical skills.
In grades 9-12, students take courses from the core. Students choose three concentration courses in grade 11 . These courses are the equivalent of high honors-level courses and meet four hours per week. Students continue with two of these concentration courses in grade 12, meeting six hours per week. (See tables to the left.) All concentration coursework in grade 12 is on par with college level courses. Students may also take additional courses not offered at LFC through CNED, an accredited online provider of French Baccalaureate courses.


## American Section - Baccalauréat Français International (BFI)

The American section of the French Baccalaureate - the Baccalauréat Français International (BFI) - is a bilingual and bicultural program developed by the French Ministry of Education in partnership with the College Board.
The American BFI is a demanding two-year diploma program chosen by academically minded global citizens, equally at ease in French and in English and determined to make a difference in the world. The American section of the BFI diploma brings together the best of two distinct perspectives on education. It combines the rigor and breadth of the French national curriculum - anchored in liberal arts, culture, and critical thinking - with the American tradition of inquiry-based experimental learning, initiative, and creativity.
The BFI-specific college level courses make academic and linguistic demands on an equal level in English and French, providing students with a university entrance qualification valid in both the US and France. For non-native English speakers, enrollment in the BFI serves as proof of English proficiency (in lieu of the TOEFL, IELTS, etc.).

## International Baccalaureate

LFC is an International Baccalaureate World School that offers both the IB Diploma Programme in grades 11 and 12 and the IB Middle Years Programme in grades 9 and 10 .


## Middle Years Programme (MYP) Grades 9-10

In grades 9 and 10, students take at least one course from the six different MYP subject groups (see table). In addition, students create and implement a research-based service project called the Community Project (grade 9) and a Personal Project (grade 10), which is a student-centered practical exploration of an area of interest through a cycle of inquiry, action and reflection.

## Diploma Programme (DP) Grades 11-12

In grades 11 and 12, students pursuing the IB Diploma choose three subjects to study at Higher Level (HL) and three at Standard Level (SL). In addition, students must also complete several IB Core requirements: Theory of Knowledge (TOK), a course about critical thinking and inquiry; Creativity, Activity and Service (CAS), a continuation of the Community Project culminating in a portfolio; and the Extended Essay (EE), a 4000 word externally assessed independent research paper on a subject of the student's choosing. Students may also take additional courses not offered at LFC through Pamoja, an accredited online provider of IB courses.

## IB Diploma

The majority of LFC IB students graduate with two diplomas: a US high school diploma and the IB Diploma. The IB Diploma Programme culminates in six final exams, evaluated by external examiners, in the student's chosen HL and SL courses. Students must receive a minimum of 24 points total on their exams each subject is graded on a scale of $1-7-$ in order to receive the IB Diploma. At least 12 points must come from HL subjects and 9 from SL subjects. In addition, students must successfully complete the IB Core (TOK, CAS and $E E$ ). The maximum number of points awarded is 45 ( 7 per subject +3 additional points for TOK and EE).

## Bilingual Diploma (BD)

An IB Bilingual Diploma will be awarded to a candidate who successfully earns a 3 or higher in two different Language \& Literature courses..

## Advanced Bilingual Diploma (ABD)

At LFC, an IB Advanced Bilingual Diploma will be awarded to a candidate who earns a 4 or higher in all three of the following courses:

- French A: Language \& Literature
- English A: Language \& Literature
- Global Politics (in French)

## Community Service \& Cultural Exchanges

LFC is committed to educating students to become well-rounded members and leaders in a global community. All high school students must complete ten hours of community service each year in grades 9-12. Additionally, students are encouraged to participate in international student exchange programs in grade 10 . Many language courses also take students on international field trips throughout their high school experience.
